During the school day students will:

- * Develop reading skills through quality text, whole group instruction, read alouds, vocabulary & spelling practice, & writing.
- Reading high-quality text & answering text-based questions
- Read texts that include a variety of vocabulary and content-based words
- Practice writing narrative, opinion, and expository essays that include text evidence.
- * Receive instruction in a workshop model using Bridges Mathematics

At home students can:

- "Read" nightly
- Practice multiplication facts 0-12
- Practice division facts 0-12
- Talk about their day and what they are learning.
