## SUCCESS AT SCHOOL

**During the school day students will:**

- Receive instruction in small groups.
- Practice trick word cards
- Receive trick words in take home folders
- Read texts that include trick words
- Practice writing sentences that build paragraphs
- \* Receive instruction in a workshop model using Bridges Mathematics

## SUCCESS AT HOME

**At home students can:**

- "Read" nightly (read pictures or words) with family member
- Practice trick words found in their take home folder
- Practice adding facts 0-12
- Practice counting and writing numbers to 1,000
- Talk about their day & what they are learning
- Pack a healthy snack in their backpack
- Have school materials ready the night before
- Get a good night's sleep (set morning alarm)
- Eat breakfast at home or at school
