SUCCESS AT SCHOOL

During the school day students will:

- Receive instruction in small groups.
- * Develop reading skills through level readers, whole group instruction, read alouds, vocabulary & spelling practice, & writing.
- Reading high-quality text and answering text-based questions
- Read texts that include a variety of vocabulary and content-based words
- Practice writing narrative, opinion, & expository paragraphs that include text evidence.
- * Receive instruction in a workshop model using Bridges Mathematics

SUCCESS AT HOME

At home students can:

- "Read" nightly
- Practice sight words found in their take home folder
- Practice multiplication facts 0-12
- Talk about their day & what they are learning
- Pack a healthy snack in their backpack
- Have school materials ready the night before
- Get a good night's sleep (set morning alarm)
- Eat breakfast at home or at school
